SUBJECT: IMPROVEMENTS TO TISDALL PARK

## RECOMMENDATION

A) THAT the Board approve the award of the landscape contract to Wilco Landscape Contractors Ltd. to implement improvements in Tisdall Park.

B) THAT no legal rights shall arise hereby, and none shall arise until execution of the contemplated contract. The Board may rescind this resolution at any time up to the execution of the contemplated contract.

## **POLICY**

Contracts in excess of \$50,000 are awarded by the Board.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On October 21, 1997 a report was sent to Council by the Director of Community Planning recommending that public realm amenities be implemented in the Oakridge/Langara neighbourhoods. The source of funding for the two parks within the Oakridge/Langara area, Tisdall and Oak Parks, was approved from Development Cost Levies, and Oakridge/Langara Community Amenity Contributions.

### **DISCUSSION**

Tisdall Park has been tendered and design improvements include a new asphalt periphery walking path, additional picnic tables, benches, drinking fountain and a children's playground (see attached plan).

The total budget, not including design fees, received from Council through the Development Cost Levies and Community Amenity Contributions is \$160,000. Design fees were also attained from Development Cost Levies.
