ROLL CALL

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The Chair advised that as there were two motions on bowling, the speakers from both bowling motions would be heard during the first motion. The Chair advised that this was to ensure that everyone had an opportunity to speak. If the first motion passed it would immediately cause the second one to be out of order.

Commissioner De Genova rose on a point of order and advised that her notice of motion had been ruled out of order but that the Chair had not provided her with the rationale. The Chair advised that as the notice was given at the Board meeting, the Chair of the Board could respond to her point of order during the Board meeting.

Commissioner De Genova challenged the ruling of the Chair

The Chair then put the question

Shall the ruling of the Chair be sustained?

CARRIED
(Commissioners Coupar and De Genova opposed)

A two-thirds majority is required to overturn the ruling of the Chair. Therefore, the ruling of the Chair was SUSTAINED.

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STAFF REPORTS

1. Public Bike Share in Parks

The Director of Transportation presented the report and responded to questions.

The Board heard from five speakers. Two opposed to the project, two who shared concerns about unintended consequences and liability and one who supported green transportation.

The Director of Recreation and the Arts and Culture Coordinator presented and responded to questions.

The Board heard from two speakers in favour of the project.

MOTIONS

1. Park Review of Bowling as a Recreational Activity

MOVED by Commissioner Barnes
SECONDED by Commissioner Loke

WHEREAS

1. The following motion, "Family Bowling Centre on Vancouver's West Side" was referred to the Vancouver Park Board for information by Vancouver City Council on Oct. 16, 2012:

"THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council recognize the importance of bowling to the health and well-being of thousands of Vancouver residents and

include access to bowling facilities in Vancouver's Healthy City Strategy 2012-2020;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT Council support the consideration of bowling in the range of recreational activities offered to Vancouver residents through our city's recreational facilities;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT staff work with Park Board to consider options for the City of Vancouver to provide a Family Bowling Centre to serve Vancouver's West side and report back to Council in conjunction with Vancouver's Healthy City Strategy 2012-2020;"

2. Section 489 of the Vancouver Charter clearly states that the Vancouver Park Board is responsible for the design, construction and programming of Vancouver's community and recreational centres;
3. One of the goals of the Park Board's strategic plan is to provide "Relevant Programs and Services" with a specific objective, '2.1 - Proactive Service Planning and Delivery';
4. In 2013, the Vancouver Park Board will be creating an action plan for strategic objective '2.1 - Proactive Service Planning and Delivery,' with a focus on reviewing and analyzing the range of recreational programming it provides as well as identifying any opportunities;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT "Bowling" as a recreational activity, be included as part of the 2013-2014 recreational review/analysis.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the results of the 2013-2014 recreational service planning review/analysis be shared with Vancouver City Council for information only.

The Board heard from 17 speakers who supported the motion, but many of whom requested the Park Board's support to retain and/or replace their local bowling alley.

2. Women in Sport

WHEREAS

1. One of the Park Board's current strategic plan objectives (1.1) is to improve inclusivity and accessibility;
2. The Women's World Cup will be coming to Canada in 2015;
3. The Vancouver Park Board has a role in ensuring equal access and participation in sports and recreation for all citizens of Vancouver;
4. Women are underrepresented in their participation and leadership roles in sports;
5. It is important to look at all ways to ensure that Women have equal opportunity to play, coach and be in leadership roles in sport.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT staff study and report to the Board on how our well our recreational system provides equal access for women; and that the Vancouver Park Board will work with the City of Vancouver, Woman's Advisory Committee, Vancouver Field Sport Federation, Vancouver Sport Network and all of our sports partners to look at ways to improve participation in sport for women in Vancouver and that staff develop a plan on what we can achieve by 2015.

The Board heard from two speakers in support of the motion.

1. Staff direct resources towards establishing the portfolio for a "Sustainability Officer" in the Park Board with the responsibility of overseeing and managing our efforts to become "Leaders in Greening";

2. Staff establish a "Leaders in Greening" Task Force comprised of community experts, staff and Commissioners to make policy recommendations and identify opportunities that would:
 - a. Develop sustainability strategy and actions for the Park Board's "Leaders in Greening" objective;
 - b. Identify performance metrics that would help to measure our achievement of these actions; and
 - c. Engage our partners, volunteers and community groups to work together in greening or educational projects that work to achieve our healthy ecosystem goals.
