# Aquarium Cetaceans By-Law Amendment & Oversight Committee Terms of Reference

November 24, 2014

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THAT the Vancouver Park Board receive for information and consideration:

- The proposed amendment of Parks Control By-law section 9e in regard to keeping cetaceans in captivity (attached as Appendix A to this report); and
- The proposed terms of reference for the establishment of an Vancouver Aquarium Oversight Committee (attached as Appendix B to this report); and

FURTHER THAT the Board direct staff to conduct further public consultation on this matter.



# A By-law to amend the Parks Control By-law regarding the keeping and breeding of cetaceans in parks

THE PARK BOARD OF THE CITY OF VANCOUVER, in public meeting, enacts as follows:

- In section 1, the Park Board adds:
  - (I) "THREATENED SPECIES" means a Cetacean species that, in the opinion of the Park Board, must be bred in captivity in order to ensure its survival."
- 2. At the end of Section 9, the Park Board adds:
  - (f) no person shall breed, or permit, suffer or allow the breeding of cetaceans in a park except that this prohibition shall not apply to the breeding of a cetacean belonging to a threatened species, with the prior approval of the Park Board."

THAT the Vancouver Park Board receive for information and consideration:

## Motion on Notice: Regulating e-cigarettes

#### WHEREAS:

The City of Vancouver passed the following recommendation at the Council meeting on October 1, 2014:

1. THAT Council approve amendments to the Health By-law to prohibit the smoking ("vapourizing") of electronic cigarettes and similar devices in the same places that tobacco smoking is disallowed;

FURTHER THAT Council instruct the Director of Legal Services to bring forward a by-law amending the Health By-law, generally as set out in Appendix A of the Policy Report dated September 18, 2014, entitled "Regulating E-cigarettes".



# Motion on Notice: Regulating e-cigarettes

- 2. THAT, conditional upon enactment of the above amendments, TransLink and the Park Board be apprised and encouraged to make similar amendments to their smoking policies.
- 3. THAT Council approve amendments to the License By-law:
  - i. prohibiting the display or sale of e-cigarettes or related products to minors, and
  - ii. authorising the Chief License Inspector to place conditions on business licenses with respect to posting signage regarding e-smoking,

FURTHER THAT Council instruct the Director of Legal Services to bring forward a by-law amending the License By-law, generally as set out in Appendix B of the Policy Report dated September 18, 2014, entitled "Regulating E-cigarettes".



# Motion on Notice: Regulating e-cigarettes

#### THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

THAT the Vancouver Park Board staff work with the City of Vancouver Legal Services to update the relevant Park Board by-laws in a manner consistent with the recommendations approved by City Council, given the health risks that electronic cigarettes pose to the public.
