## Vancouver Commemorates Canada 150+ Program

- Vancouver's celebrations branded as 'Canada 150+'
  - Highlight official role as City of Reconciliation
  - Deliberate strategy to view milestone from Indigenous lens
- Consist of \$6.2m program
  - \$2.3m Canada 150 Fund
  - \$2.4m City of Vancouver
  - \$1.5m sponsorship initiatives/activities

- Walk Vancouver: *The Land Beneath Your* 
  - Challenge to residents to walk 150+ kilometres
  - Launch of new interactive, mobile friendly maps
  - Walking routes to reflect indigenous culture & history
  - Grant of \$53,000
- Timeline
  - Launch on Move for Health Day (May 10)
  - 3 community pop-up walks in June, July & August
  - Conclude at Walk for Reconciliation (September 24)





- Youth-Directed Engagement Projects
  - 150+ Canadian Stereotypes (Myth or Fact)
    - Youth to identify and research Canadian stereotypes
  - 150+ Stories on Canada
    - Youth to meet with people of all ages and ethnicities, including immigrants and Aboriginal people, to discover stories about Canada
  - 150+ youth engaged in film, photography, art & community outreach
  - Grant of \$50,000
- Timeline
  - Youth trained in interview techniques & documentary filming (April & May)
  - 150+ youth produced stories, films & artwork published online (June)

- Thunderbird Sharing Ceremony
  - Performance by Aeriosa Dance & Spakwus Slulem (Eagle Song) that journeys from the sandy shores of Stanley Park to the heights of its ancient forest
  - Includes celebration and ceremony with three local Nations and Urban Aboriginal artists
  - Grant of \$25,000
- Timeline
  - Rehearsals in Stanley Park in June & July
  - Performance in Stanley Park (July 15) and VPL Central Branch (July 22)





- Wild Salmon Caravan
  - Celebrates the wild salmon's journey as a symbol of Indigenous strength, resiliency & inspiration for community arts engagement & action
  - Travelling Parade, Art Workshops & Literary Events to culminate in documentary
  - Grant of \$35,000
- Timeline
  - Wild Salmon Caravan at Grandview Nights (August 25)
  - Wild Salmon Caravan Arts Workshops across Vancouver (September)
  - Wild Salmon Caravan Parade from Vancouver Aboriginal Friendship Centre to Trout Lake CC (October 7)


