




Park Board completed the new Creekside Playground in August 2017. It is one of the most accessible playgrounds in Vancouver.





- Pilot of beer and wine on beach











Aquatics: Swim to Survive










Park Board partnered with the Lifesaving Society and Lifeguard Outreach Society and offered Swim to Survive program to 2,000 Vancouver youth over three days.
