- Seek Board decision on the policy.




- City has identified a need for more childcare in Vancouver, particularly full day licensed spaces
- Park Board and Community Centre Associations (CCAs) are key public partners for non-profit childcare spaces
- All Park Board community centres have childcare (primarily preschool/after school care). There are few all day childcare spaces in community centres
- CCAs have expressed interest in expanding full day childcare to fill this gap
- Group licensed childcare requires a minimum amount of outdoor space per child. Provincial <u>Child Care Licensing Regulation (VCH)</u> and <u>City of Vancouver's Childcare</u> <u>Design Guidelines</u>



Background: Policy Context

- Community Centre Strategy:
 - Finding a Balance: "Consider co-location of group child care and integration of other child care programs into community centres where feasible while balancing all parks and recreation needs."
 - Develop Policy: "Develop policy to address CCA requests for dedicated use of park space to support new at grade group child care programs in existing community centres for Board consideration"
- VanPlay:
 - **Goal 2: Park Protection:** Protect existing parks and recreation spaces from loss, encroachment, and densification.



Proposed Policy Overview

- Supports new or expanded full day group childcare programming in existing community centres.
- In short, the policy allows:
 - A limited, designated area of park space,
 - Adjacent to a community centre,
 - For specific hours (at minimum during childcare operating hours),
 - To be designed for, and used exclusively by a childcare program
- Provides this space to meet mandated licencing requirements for outdoor space, required for licensed indoor childcare programs.





Proposed Policy Criteria

- **Criteria** have been developed to balance PB's responsibility to provide public space with the opportunity to support provision of non-profit childcare
 - Allows conversion of park space adjacent to existing community centre
 - Aligned with minimum provincial group childcare outdoor space requirement
 - Supports new or expanded licensed indoor group childcare
 - Submitted by an existing or proposed operator of a childcare in a community centre







Proposed Policy Criteria

- Requires no significant negative impacts or conflicts, including to:
 - Existing or planned park or recreation uses
 - Park access within a neighbourhood
- The outdoor space will be designed by applicant with support and review from Park Board staff to meet both childcare program requirements as well as Park Development standards.
