- Khalsa Diwan Society Sports Festival Commissioner Digby attended the Khalsa Diwan Society 56th Annual Sports Festival at Memorial Park.
- South Memorial Park Pond Commissioner Digby visited South Memorial Park Pond, which appears to be in vigorous growth this spring.
- Spray Park at Lumberman's Arch Commissioner Digby visited Stanley Park and was pleased to see that the Spray Park at Lumberman's Arch was in full action on the first hot summer weekend of 2024.

1. BC Recreation and Parks Association – Parks Excellence Award

The Director of Park Planning and Development introduced the item, and the President of the BC Recreation and Parks Association provided some background information on the Parks Excellence Award, and then presented the Award to the Park Board for the construction of sθəgəlxenəm ts'exwts'áxwi7.

2. General Manager's Report

The General Manager <u>presented</u> the General Manager's Report, highlighting:

- Youth Week 2024 was celebrated from May 1-7, 2024, which involved 3 city-wide events including a Queer Prom for 2SLGBTQIA+ youth, a Youth Week Skate Jam at Plaza Skate Park, an indoor volleyball tournament at Killarney Community Centre, and several other smaller community events in Community Centres across the city.
- Staff recently completed the replaced of the irrigation main at Queen Elizabeth Park, restoring water supply to the Rose Garden, Lawn Bowling, and both the small and large quarry. The park welcomes 6 million visitors per year, and this repair ensures continued high level of service.
- A contractor has been selected through public tender process for replacement of the pedestrian bridge across Musqueam Creek in Musqueam Park.
