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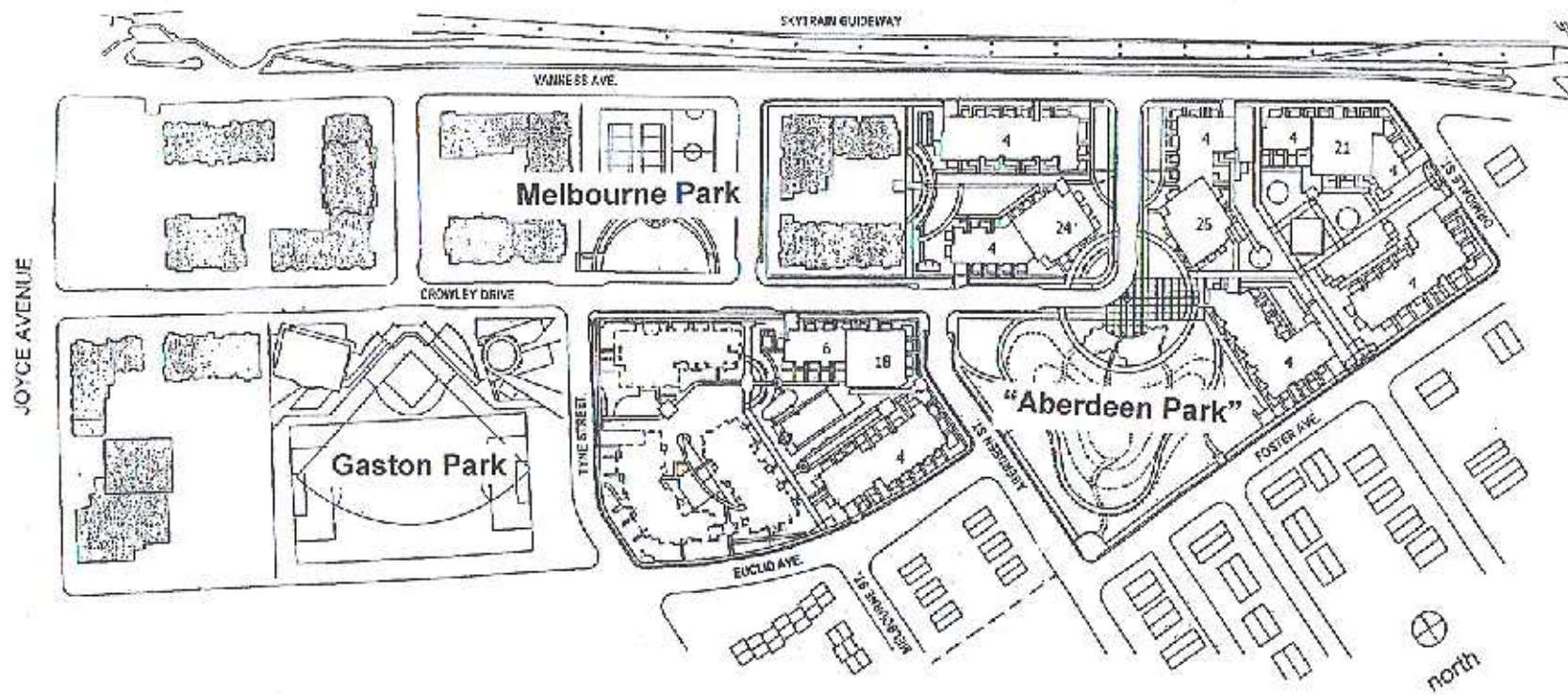

Summary of comments received from March 13 open house.

Water park acceptable with simple style of spray jets,
Creation of rolling topography desirable, low mounds at street, 5' knoll, level open lawn ok for informal play/picnic;
Play area encouraged for small kids;
Include seating with view to play area;
Consider community garden in area;
Round corners where paths/plaza meet;
Skateboarders need a place to go to reduce damage elsewhere, consider designated skateboard area;
Concern for skateboard use and damage to park and conflict with other users;
Consider picnic tables and barbeque area;
Provide for ample garbage containers;
Deter cycling on paths or methods to reduce conflict with pedestrians;
Consider donation program for benches;
Encourage evening use (to 10:00 Pm), include lighting for paths but not fields;
Consider dog off-leash area;
Add flower gardens where appropriate for colour and seasonal interest. Variety of trees for seasonal interest;
Open views from small plaza to play area important;
Consider track for radio controlled cars;

Generally positive response to overall design, including size and route of paths, amount of trees, play structures and water play, mounds and lookout plaza.
Passive use by seniors, families and kids desirable.
