RECOMMENDATION

BACKGROUND

Staff at both the City and the Park Board recently received an invitation to submit an application under the World Health New Organization's Program to become a BC Community Partner. The deadline for submission is March 15th.

DISCUSSION

The Park Board as well as many City Departments have contributed significantly to making Vancouver an age-friendly community.
