- Artist studios in former caretaker suites:
 - 1. Second Beach
 - 2. Pandora Park
 - 3. Burrard View Park
- 96 artists will take part in residency program between Apr 2014 - Oct 2015 (3 - 4 weeks each);



• Biennale responsible for all artist activities and will return suites to their original (or improved) condition.



- Community-engagement opportunities
- Public viewing of artists at work
- Films, lectures and panels
