

Existing Facilities Require Replacement

- Existing facilities nearing end of useful life
- 1551 Quebec St
 Development
 requires relocation
 of existing facilities
- Docks and sheds originally planned were not built





Non-Motorized Boating Facility Study


- Current facilities in SEFC inadequate and need replacing
- Large gap between program demand and quality infrastructure
- Site immediately north of Creekside adjacent to Ferry dock is optimal location

Conceptual Design Drawing




Conceptual Design Rendering




Non-Motorized Boating Facility Study

- Phase 1 paddling centre is designed to meet needs of current boating programs
- Facility will replace and improve existing dock, floats and sheds at ~\$3M
- Facility is designed for maximum flexibility:
 - incremental
 - moveable
 - expandable
 - adaptable




Modular Components allow for easy expansion and flexibility in layout


Conceptual Design Cross-Section








PHASE 1 Site Section - Low Tide

Non-Motorized Boating Strategy (2014)

Strategy will guide the City/Park Board to maximize use of existing facilities and better respond to emerging waterfront opportunities

OBJECTIVE:

Develop comprehensive strategy to guide future planning and investment in nonmotorized boating facilities beyond the paddling centre at Creekside

- A review of leading practices from other jurisdictions
- The determination of a framework to assess overall Creek capacity
- The development of service level benchmarks and priority areas of focus, including recreational and competitive paddling sports
- The identification of potential opportunities for collaborative programming and coordination among service providers
- The development of an approach to long term service planning for waterfront facilities
