- Entertainment and Exhibition Facilities: \$13.75M



- Parks and open space account for about
 28% of the Civic Lands
- Parks and recreation buildings account for about 34% of all floor area owned by the City
- The total portfolio has a replacement value of about \$2.6 billion (excluding land) which is 13% of all assets owned by the City












Phase 2: City Public Engagement Draft Capital Plan





- Acquiring new park land



Managing Capital Plan Growth: Impact on Debt, Property Tax & User Fees








Debt

- flat at 2012-14 level (\$96M/yr)


Capital from Revenue + Other Operating Funding
