



# West End Mayor's Advisory Committee (WEMAC)

## Rezoning Application Community Priorities Scorecard

#### **Purpose**

This scorecard is used by WEMAC when conducting reviews of rezoning application proposals. The content of this scorecard was developed based on the results of the West End Priorities Survey completed in June 2011 and the subsequent WEMAC interim report that was issued to the Office of the Mayor on July 20, 2011 (*Community Priorities for the West End*).

#### **Summary**

According to the mandate that was given by Vancouver City Council, WEMAC was given the task of developing and implementing a process to gather feedback from West End's residents to determine priority areas related to development and the community. Utilizing this data, WEMAC is to meet with developers as representatives of the community to comment on rezoning application proposals and provide feedback based on priorities highlighted by the community.

### **Priority Selection**

Priorities determined for this scorecard were taken directly from the information contained in the WEMAC Interim Report. Based on this information, and for the purposes of this scorecard, priorities were eliminated that were not related to development. In consideration of the priorities not already included and through examining the additional common themes and issues from survey respondents, additional items were included in the scorecard and considered as value added for the West End Community.

### **Meeting Process**

The rezoning applicant is invited to present information to WEMAC related to their most current rezoning application. WEMAC has the opportunity to ask questions of the applicant to clarify information presented. After presentation and discussion is complete, the applicant is dismissed and WEMAC continues to meet to complete the priorities scorecard.

### **Scoring Process**

Each WEMAC member considers the information presented by the rezoning applicant and individually assigns a score within the scoring criteria for each priority. After completion of the scorecard, each member shares their assigned scores with the committee for group discussion. Each member has the opportunity to adjust their individual score after discussion. To determine a final score, an average of scores for each priority is taken and a final score determined.

#### **Information Sharing**

The final scorecard is shared publicly through the West End Community page on the City of Vancouver website, distributed to the applicant, and with the appropriate city staff.
