Purpose



To seek Board approval for the Stanley Park Lawn Bowling Club to pursue its application to the Liquor Control Board for a Liquor Primary Club Licence.


Background



- Stanley Park Lawn Bowling Club (SPLBC) is a voluntary, not for profit organization;
- This year SPLBC will be celebrating its 100 year anniversary.
- 260 bowling members and 70 social members;
- Largest Lawn Bowling Club in Canada;
- Named the Vancouver and District Lawn Bowling Association's Club of the Year 2015.

Background





- Active season between mid-April to mid-October;
- Bowling takes place daily;
- Current operating agreement in effect until May 17/20.

Discussion



- Current agreement allows club to serve alcohol;
 - must not breach any Park Board & CoV policies;
 - must comply with Liquor Control and Licensing Act;
- no noise complaints or incidents resulting in VPD or Liquor Inspector response



Discussion



- Required to get a Special Event Permit (SEP) for each members event;
- SEP are a considerable expense;
- Current provincial regulations state an organization can only apply for two (2) SEPs/month;
- The current licensing does not permit alcohol at a majority of the club's functions from April to October.

Benefits



An annual liquor licence will allow the SP Lawn Bowling Club to:

- Operate with less cost and easier administration;
- Provide option of liquor service for all member events throughout the season between the hours of 11:00am to 11:00pm;
- Continue to serve alcohol to their private members and invitees only – no service to the general public.

Recommendation





THAT the Vancouver Park Board approve an application by the Stanley Park Lawn Bowling Club to the Liquor Control Board to obtain a Liquor Primary Club Licence.
