Hastings	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Will not sign the current document, but commit to continuing to work toward an acceptable JOA- Happy to continue to work on things; want to achieve a deal- Change in appendices language is substantial, thus need more time for legal review

Kerrisdale	<ul style="list-style-type: none">- Reviewing with legal new wording offered by Park Board to strengthen the Appendices- Requires two weeks to frame an initial response

Motion approved by the Active Transportation Policy Council on Sep 13:

- Considers improvements to Seaside Greenway to be a priority Park Board issue
- Urges Park Board to present proposed designs to the Committee for feedback
- Asks Park Board to make necessary improvements as soon as possible so that Seaside Greenway path between Burrard Bridge and Balsam Street will be safe and comfortable for people using active transportation.

City Council Decision: Mobi Bike Share & LAP



Motion approved by the Active Transportation Policy Council on Sep 13 :

- Improving Access to Low Income Residents to the Mobi Bike Share Program
- Recommends the City of Vancouver and Vancouver Parks Board look at including the Mobi Bike Share Program as part of the Leisure Access Program.
