

Purpose of Presentation



- Present and review request from Rare Indigo Destination Management to:
 - Host a private special event for the Würth Group at Brockton Point in Stanley Park
 - Obtain a Special Event Permit to serve alcohol at the aforementioned initiative
- Seek Board approval for this application



Event Context



- City's meeting and convention industry is a major economic driver
- Tourism Vancouver and industry partners proactively market the City as a convention destination
- Würth Group Congress is a signature 2019 event
- While convention activities tend to be centered around the VCC, many conferences also integrate offsite events into their programs






Würth Group Overview



- Global market leader in assembly/ fastening products:

- Selected Vancouver as the host city for their global Congress
- Approximately 1,600 guests will be welcomed to the city
- Focus on showcasing the best that Vancouver has to offer



Rare Indigo Destination Management Overview




- Leading locally-based destination management company

Proposal



- Rare Indigo is seeking approval to host a private special event at Brockton Point in Stanley Park:
 - Sunday, May 19, 2019, from 5:00pm to 11:00pm
 - Capacity for 1,600 guests
 - Flow-thru style evening reception:
 - Roaming entertainment, simple lawn games, and music with modest amplification
- Also seeking a Special Event Permit to serve alcohol at the aforementioned event



Key Parameters

VANCOUVER

BOARD OF PARKS
AND RECREATION

- Utilize northern section of the north cricket field
- Adjacent parking lot would also be used during set-up/tear down, and on the event day
- Event set-up/tear-down
 - Set-up will require 3 days
 - Tear-down will require 2 days
- Key event components:
 - Large clearspan tent, two service tents, washroom trailers, F&B equipment, and mix of seating & tables


- Organizer will be responsible for attendee by-law compliance
- Key benefits include:
 - Collaboration and support of Vancouver's important tourism industry
 - Recognition of three Host Nations
 - Potential collaboration/support with Stanley Park partners
 - Showcasing Vancouver and Stanley Park to new and future users
 - Incremental revenues



Next Steps




- Subject to Board approval:
 - Organizers will take the necessary steps to meet all FEST Committee requirements
 - Obtain a Special Event Permit from BC Liquor Control & Licensing Branch
 - Integrate elements into their program to recognize the significance of the event location (ancestral lands of the MST)

- Event will:
 - Support Vancouver's meeting and convention industry
 - Showcase one of the city's most attractive and significant locations
 - Deliver range of benefits
- Staff have carefully considered the various aspects of this application
- Confident that initiative can be delivered successfully in the location and manner intended



Recommendation



- A. THAT the Vancouver Park Board approve an application from Rare Indigo Destination Management, to host a private special event for the Würth Group with a capacity for 1,600 guests, at the north cricket field at Brockton Point in Stanley Park on Sunday, May 19, 2019, from 5:00pm to 11:00pm, with all arrangements to the satisfaction of the General Manager of the Park Board; and
- B. FURTHER THAT the Board approve an application from Rare Indigo Destination Management for a Special Event Permit from the BC Liquor Control & Licensing Branch to serve alcohol at the aforementioned location and date, with a maximum capacity of 1,600 guests.
