

## PARK BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

— November 19, 2018 —

The following information is intended to provide a brief overview of the Board's governance work at the Committee and Board meetings. The full agenda, meeting materials, video clips and official minutes can be found on the <u>Park Board website</u>.

#### **CHAIR'S REPORT**

Park Board Chair Mackinnon noted that starting in December, the Chair's report would move back to the Regular Board agenda and focus on Park Board organized events. Staff are developing a new process to feature community events in a more flexible online album. For November, the Chair highlighted the following community events attended by Commissioners:

### VanSplash: Vancouver Aquatics Strategy - Advisory Group Selection Process

The Board approved the <u>advisory group selection process</u>, which forms the foundation of an effective advisory group. Member recruitment will have an open call for applications through various media, with direct outreach to stakeholders and contacts developed through the VanSplash Process. The aim is to appoint 20 members to represent the various categories of aquatics usage. Advisory group applications will be vetted based on approved selection criteria and a scoring matrix to ensure balance.

## **TGD2S Programming Update and Corporate Sponsorship Fund Request**

The Board approved a contribution of \$35,000 from the Corporate Sponsorship Fund to support the expansion of Trans, Gender Diverse, and Two-Spirit arts and culture programming in community centres and parks through new access and inclusion focussed initiatives delivered in partnership with the Queer Arts Festival. The Park Board has a 20 year relationship with the QAF, which has grown from a small community art exhibition into one of Canada's most important festivals exploring TGD2S arts and culture.

### Park Board Meeting Dates - Proposed 2019 Schedule

The Board approved the <u>Committee and Regular Board meeting dates for 2019</u>, including the 6:30pm start time introduced in 2018, as well as the Tuesday evening reserves.
