

# PARK BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

— May 27, 2019 —

#### STAFF REPORTS / PRESENTATIONS

### **Volleyball BC Vancouver Open Event - Licensed Area Expansion**

The Board approved a <u>request from Volleyball BC</u>, organizers of the Vancouver Open beach volleyball tournament, to increase the capacity of the event's licensed area at Kitsilano Beach from 500 guests to 650 guests. The all-age's event attracts over 20,000 spectators annually and is free to attend. Activities include a youth volleyball tournament, prize giveaways, interactive crowd activities, food and beverages, and some of the best beach volleyball action in North America.

# **Expanding Downtown Eastside Greenspace and Waterfront Access**

This item was referred from the Regular Board meeting on May 13, 2019, to hear from speakers. After hearing from 19 speakers, the Board unanimously approved the <u>amended motion</u> requesting that the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority to identify further opportunities to make investments in the local Downtown Eastside community with a particular focus on parks, recreation, and Reconciliation, and that the Park Board explore the initiation of a working group in partnership with the City of Vancouver and community stakeholders with a goal to transition the development and construction of an indigenous-focussed healing, wellness, and/or cultural centre out of the theoretical and into action and reality

- BC Hydro Project at Nelson Park consultants have been hired to lead the impact assessment and public engagement on the rights-of-way request from BC Hydro.

  - May 28: Proposed Amendments to City Sponsorship Policy Review; Regulating Clothing Donation Bins; 2019 Downtown Eastside (DTES) Capital Grant Program Allocation.
