Jun 24/19	Lawn Fertilizers Used in Parks	In reference to a May 10/19 tweet stating that the Park Board uses about 110,000 pounds of organic lawn fertilizers per year, a Board member requested if this can be broken down to differentiate between organic-based fertilizers (only a portion is organic) vs. fully organic.	Work is underway to provide the information requested for the usage breakdown of organic vs. organic-based fertilizers. As data needs to be collected from multiple sites and involves consolidating reporting from all Park Operations superintendents, it is anticipated that this information will be available by the end of July. Jun 24/19	No-Smoking Signage in Parks	A Board member requested information about adding more non-smoking signage in parks, noting that the Kits Beach entrance at Maple & Ogden had none.	Park Operations staff manage signage needs throughout the park & beach system. In response to increasing concerns regarding smoking , staff have ordered decals for beach garbage totes, 15 new sandwich boards to place along beach paths, and have requested pole-mounted signs to be installed at all beach entrance points.	
Jun 24/19			The mural painting on the emergency response container at Hillcrest Community Centre was completed as a youth art project with the assistance of a local artist. Staff will reach out to the Kerrisdale Community Centre Society to discuss options to facilitate a similar mural project for the emergency container located at the site.	IN PROCESS
Jun 24/19	Public-Private Partnerships in VanPlay	A Board member enquiried if public-private partnerships were being considered as part of VanPlay	VanPlay encourages innovative approaches to the delivery of services to meet in part the demands of increased population and changing demographics. Included in this is consideration of partners with external groups. The Strategy does not get to the level of detail required to determine whether a Public-Private Partnership (P3) would be appropriate for any given service.	COMPLETE
Jun 24/19		A Board member enquired whether it was possible to provide public access to the Fraser River shorleine along the southern boundary of McCleery Golf Course.	The Fraser River trail runs the entire river frontage of the McCleery Golf Course. This public pathway is open to pedestrians, equestrians, and cyclists.	COMPLETE
