 - Roundhouse Community Centre
 - Queen Elizabeth Park



Background

- The City of Vancouver is implementing the <u>Electric Vehicle Ecosystem Strategy</u>, approved by Council November 16, 2016.
- EV charging stations were previously approved by the Park Board to be installed at Killarney, Trout Lake and Dunbar community centres on Jan 15, 2018.



Proposed Park Board Sites



Propose minimum of 2 EV charging stations with adequate infrastructure to add additional stations in the future to keep pace with the transition to a low carbon future
















EV Chargers at Parks and Community Centres



The current need for EV charging stations:

- More public charging stations are needed to encourage a shift to a low carbon future
- Existing charging stations are not equitably distributed across Vancouver
- A public charging station network will support those unable to charge at home or at work







Recommendation



THAT the Vancouver Park Board approve the installation of electric vehicle charging stations in Queen Elizabeth Park and at Champlain Heights, Douglas Park, Kensington, Kitsilano, Renfrew, and Roundhouse Community Centres, subject to the satisfaction of the Park Board General Manager.
