

Park Board General Manager's Office Report January 20, 2020

The following report is intended to provide an overview and update on recent and upcoming activities within the Park Board.

Holiday Events

2019 was another successful year for Park Board Holiday events:

- The 35th annual VanDusen "Festival of Lights" (FOL) welcomed a record 148,000 attendees this season (compared to 119,000 in 2018). The event was well received by the public, with several media outlets recognizing it as the city's best holiday lighting experience. This year also marked the 19th anniversary of the Park Board's partnership with the Make-A-Wish Foundation.
- Bloedel Conservatory celebrated its 50th anniversary with "Festivale Tropicale". Set inside the historic dome at the peak of QE Park, this holiday event attracted over 36,000 visitors (compared to 27,000 in 2018).
- This was the 22nd year the Park Board has collaborated with the BC Professional Fire Fighters Burn Fund to deliver "Bright Nights in Stanley Park", where 103,000 people rode the festive train. As well, the Burn Fund's inaugural 5K Santa Run spread cheer with hundreds of runners disguised as jolly Saint Nick running through Stanley Park.

Extreme Weather Response

During the week of January 13-17, the Lower Mainland was hit by inclement weather, with heavy snowfall, winds, and icy conditions experienced throughout the week. Through a coordinated effort that delivered great results, the Park Operations crews brined, plowed and salted throughout the week, prioritizing access to Park Board facilities, including community centres, work yards, and parks.
