
## Homeless Encampments in Parks

- VANCOUVER BOARD OF PARKS AND RECREATION
- Mar 31 Province, City, and Park Board signed an <u>MOU on Support for Unsheltered</u> <u>Vancouver Residents</u> to formalize commitment to work together to end the Strathcona Park encampment and help prevent future encampments in Vancouver;
- City and BC Housing continue to prepare spaces to incrementally move people into housing that matches their needs;
- GM Orders issued Feb 10, Mar 30, and Apr 9 to restrict temporary shelters in Strathcona Park; all shelters to be removed by Apr 30;
- Regular community updates being provided; posted on <u>BC Housing's</u> <u>website.</u>

- Staff planning for resumption of a full operational season following the COVID-19 protocols from last year.
- Defined swim sessions with separate registrations for length and public swimming will also resume
- Return of limited aquafit and swim lesson sessions also in development.
