Purpose of Presentation



To provide the Board with an update on the organization's fundraising initiatives and foundation development.

Background – Fundraising & Development Office





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- Fundraising and development initiatives support the Park Board's mandate and contribute to long-term financial sustainability
- Fundraising operations generate approximately \$1 million annually in donation revenue; key program areas include:
 - Dedicated Park Bench Program (45%)
 - Recreation projects (30%)
 - Planned giving (15%)
 - Park conservation (10%)

Background – Fundraising & Development Office



- Philanthropic giving provides the Park Board with an important source of incremental funding
- Directly supports VanPlay Framework Goal 10 (Secure Adequate and Ongoing Funding)

Background – Foundation





Background – Foundation



- In 2015, the Board approved a motion to develop a plan to establish a public foundation
- Purpose of the foundation would be to advocate for and champion community generosity, increase fundraising capacity, and provide an incremental source of sustainable funding
- In 2016, the Board approved \$250,000 from the donation reserve to support the development of this plan

Foundation – Work Completed to Date





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- Stage 1 consultant work (2017 to early 2019) informed the development of initial foundation components:
 - Strategic plan, fundraising plan & initial fundraising priority setting
 - Budget requirements & revenue forecasting models
 - Case for support & mission/vision/values statements
 - Policies, constitution & by-laws & governance requirements
 - Staff resourcing & foundation board/governance requirements
 - Provincial and federal registration completed public charitable foundation registered (Vancouver Parks and Recreation Foundation)

Foundation – Work Completed to Date



- Stage 2 consultant work (mid to late-2019) advised on the essential components required to ensure long-term success; additional work still required to complete these components:
 - Foundation infrastructure (leadership, staffing & seed funding)
 - Foundation champions (recruiting a founding board, securing community advocates & Commissioner roles)
 - Foundation brand identity (developing a communication strategy, brand development, public awareness campaign, website updates & new online donation pages)







- Stage 2 plan advancement paused due to:
 - Changing organizational priorities due to pandemic
 - Further work needed to develop a foundation that is viable and sustainable (e.g. recruiting foundation Board of Directors, developing case for support & communications strategy)
 - Additional resources required to build out foundation (e.g. seed funding to hire executive director & development staff, budget to operationalize)



- Annual CRA (Canada Revenue Agency) filings for the foundation to remain compliant have been completed
- However, foundation's society is not compliant with BC Registrar of Societies (requires 3 directors; currently has 2 due to former Park Board GM retirement)
- Current foundation society directors:
 - Francie Connell (Director of Legal Services & City Solicitor)
 - Kelly Oehlschlager (Assistant Director Corporate, Legal Services)



- Foundation compliance requirements needing action:
 - Honorary members of the society (current Park Board Commissioners) must nominate a 3rd director (current Park Board GM)
 - > Action item:
 - Engage current Commissioners to complete this nomination process (will occur electronically via Board memo by October 30, 2021)



- Foundation compliance requirements needing action:
 - Society required to hold Annual General Meeting (AGM):
 - Action items:
 - AGM will occur electronically (by December 31, 2021); participation required by society directors only
 - Annual report to be filed with BC Registrar of Societies (within 30 days of AGM date)







- While awaiting next steps in foundation development, staff are actively developing an Enhanced Fundraising Plan (EFP)
- EFP will focus on a few key funding priorities, expand on existing fundraising programs and leverage opportunities
- Key areas of focus will include:
 - Playground renewals
 - Planned giving and legacy gifts
 - Park conservation



- Directly support VanPlay Goal 10
 - Secure adequate and ongoing funding for the repair, renewal and replacement of our aging parks and recreation system with a goal to increase awareness of the funding needs within VanPlay and obtain philanthropic support of equity zone initiatives



- EFP will require input and resources (from staff and Commissioners) to support key project steps:
 - Determine fundraising priorities
 - Develop fundraising strategy, plan & goals
 - Develop communication strategy & promote the need
 - Secure community advocates, champions & Commissioner support
 - Integrate existing fundraising programs to align with VanPlay



 EFP will assist in informing foundation feasibility/potential and determine whether a public foundation can remain sustainable and provide the Park Board with additional incremental funding

- Fundraising & development initiatives generate important and incremental revenues to support the Park Board's mandate
- Further work is required to inform recommendations and next steps in foundation development
- Key actions to be undertaken by staff in the interim:
 - Completing foundation society compliance requirements
 - Developing EFP to expand fundraising opportunities while awaiting foundation development
 - Further discussions to take place in 2022 with foundation society board to determine next steps in foundation development
