

Historic Streams & Daylighting





Required Engagement & Review: Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh



- Issue project referrals to the Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh (MST) governments in 2021-2022
- Musqueam has been supportive of the Spanish Banks Creek and Salish Creek projects; archaeological oversight was conducted for both
- Parallel provincial Indigenous referral process would happen with the Crown Tenure applications; staff to find efficiencies during the review.









West Parking Lot A at Spanish Banks Beach Park West Extension, looking north towards English Bay







Proposed Project Timeline





Benefits



Benefits



- Increase biodiversity introducing native plants and creation of new habitat for wildlife (VanPlay Goal 7: Restore Vancouver's Wild Spaces and Vital Biodiversity)
- Favour connection and integration networks where play, exercise and socialize combine with naturalization of pathways for movement of urban wildlife (VanPlay Bold Move 3: Connectivity – Citywide Parks and Recreation Network)
- Opportunity to combine engagement and implementation efforts in bringing this OLA into compliance (People Parks and Dogs Strategy Policy)
- Promote enhancement projects in high profile locations for high educational value return, increasing awareness and support.

THAT the Vancouver Park Board directs staff to proceed with planning for the daylighting of Canyon Creek at Spanish Banks Beach Park, with the scoping work to include:

- A. Initiating engagement with Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh (MST) Nations;
- B. Submitting tenure applications for a Crown Land Lease and a Water Sustainability Act Approval; and
- C. Preparing preliminary implementation costing for 2023-2026 Capital Plan.
