# East Park Engagement Launch

- East Park – a new park proposed as part of the completion of the SEFC ODP is initiating Round 1 Public Engagement from Nov 16<sup>th</sup> – Dec 8<sup>th</sup> 2022
- Engagement activities include:
  - Shape Your City project page with a survey, videos, and background information

  - On-site signage, pop-up event, storyline, and native plant tour
- Next steps: Engagement results will be used to develop concept options, which will be refined into a preferred concept for Board decision in early 2024





- CSI Pacific shared their gratitude for Vancouver Parks and Recreation's support in their 2021-2022 Year in Review
- Park Board's partnership with CSI Pacific reduces the cost barrier for these Olympic athlete's to use Vancouver's fitness facilities





- Park Board staff collaborated with Vancouver Cherry Blossom Festival for their ongoing Tree Walks and Talks initiatives
- Joe McLeod, Reg Eddy, Don Morrison and Mike Alkema from the Urban Forestry team led two walks with over 30 attendees each



- Council to receive a report on the Contract Award for South Kinross Park Construction on November 16. The Park Board approved concept plans for this park in 2017. Staff's recommendations on this report include designating South Kinross Park as a permanent public park in addition to approving the construction contract award.
- Council to receive a report on November 16 regarding Vancouver Community Sport Hosting Grants – Fall 2022 Intake. Recommendations include approving 16 grant applications totalling \$89,050. The report also includes an update on the grants that celebrate and honour Indigenous Sport Champions from Musqueam, Squamish, and Tsleil-Waututh Nations and the Urban Native Youth Association.
