

### 2022 Work Completed – Post King Tide




- Draining of pool, and RJC structural assessment
- Replacement of:
  - Pool main drain valve
  - Pool gutter crack repairs
  - Automatic make-up water valve
  - DDC system for monitoring installed
- Seawall repairs including inner and outer stonework



#### 2023 Repair Work



- Pool Drained/Additional Testing:
  - Inspection and scanning help to inform on what repairs are required and mitigation strategies
  - Hydrostatic valve replacement
  - Water Loss is substantial (approximately 27,300 litres per hour)



#### **Environmental Considerations**

- 2022 End of Spill Report
- 2023 Pool Draining Procedures
- Water Volume Loss Testing: assessing the volume/quality of water that continues to be lost from the pool.
- Pool Operational Procedure Review: changes that will mitigate any identified risks to the marine receiving environment.







Weather Requirements:

- The schedule for 2023 includes the majority of the additional work required to attend to the application of caulking and coating for the cracks and joint repairs.
- Requires 3-5 days of complete dryness.
- Based on current weather/temperature forecasts we expect to be able to complete by end of this week(May 8-12)



#### Pool Scheduled Opening to Public



- Additional 2 weeks are required to fill, treat and heat the pool for opening
- Potentially pushing the opening of the pool to the first week of June
