

Sunset Seniors Centre Public Information Session

- Information session will be held at the Sunset Community Centre on January 25 from 3-5PM
- The Seniors Centre demonstrates leadership in meeting the City's sustainability goals and policies.
- Construction expected to begin in Fall 2024, with substantial completion in December 2025
- The new centre will be almost 10,000 sqft. and feature various multipurpose rooms, a commercial kitchen, lounge, offices, a reception area, and washrooms.



104th Polar Bear Swim at English Bay

- On January 1, the Vancouver Park Board hosted the 104th Polar Bear Swim at English Bay.
- A record breaking 8,683 registered participants.
- The Peter Pantages memorial trophy and winners of the 100m race was awarded to Gareth Jones and Ridley Judkins.



- VanDusen Botanical Garden and Bloedel Conservatory and Festival of Lights had record-breaking attendance for 2023.
- VanDusen regular admissions increased by 18%
- Bloedel regular admissions increased by 33%
- Festival of Lights, recently named as one of the worlds most spectacular light displays by Conde Nast Traveler, had an increase of 12% visitation



Killarney Society Holiday Tree Lighting

- The Killarney Society hosted a Tree Lighting event on Saturday, Nov 25, 2023.
- The event featured a youth orchestra, senior choir, ornament making, cookie decorating, and hot chocolate.
- The Society purchased all the lights for the event, installed a dedicated timer with help from the Park Board electrical department, and partnered with the Vancouver Fire Rescue Services to hang the lights.
- A \$500 donation was made to the Burn Fund to thank VFRS for their time and community involvement.

Council to receive a report on January 24, 2024 titled “2024 Budget Adjustment related to risk mitigation of the Hemlock Looper Moth in Stanley Park”, which recommends the approval of a one-time 2024 operating budget increase of \$4.9 million for the Vancouver Board of Parks and Recreation to fund immediate work required to mitigate the risk of trees damaged by the Hemlock Looper Moth within Stanley Park.
