

PARK BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS — May 12, 2025 —

STAFF REPORTS / PRESENTATIONS

Urban Forestry Strategy

The Board approved the <u>Urban Forest Strategy - 2025 Update</u>. The urban forest is a vital piece of infrastructure and a globally recognized part of Vancouver's identity, delivering broad benefits across every neighbourhood. It cools streets, cleans the air, supports biodiversity, and promotes public health—bringing nature into the city while strengthening climate resilience and enhancing daily life. Key changes in the Strategy include an updated canopy cover target of 30%, improved integration of equity and reconciliation values, and modernized strategy framework with a fiscally responsible action plan. The Strategy embraces a "right tree, right place, right pace" principle, highlighting a thoughtful and strategic approach to managing the urban forest. Goals, objectives, and actions have been updated to optimize the delivery of urban forest ecosystem services that advance climate resilience, and sustainability to ensure the long-term resilience of Vancouver's urban forest aligning with overarching plans and policies.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The General Manager presented an overview of the GM's Report:

- King Charles Coronation Medal Two Community Centre Association Directors have received the King Charles III Coronation Medal. This medal is awarded to outstanding individuals who have made a lasting difference in their communities through a lifetime of work. It recognizes their commitment and dedication and the impact they had made.
- Passing of Bonnie Mackenzie On April 16th, 2025, Bonnie Mackenzie peacefully passed away. Bonnie spent six years on the Board of the West End Community Centre; several as Treasurer and one as President. Bonnie was pivotal in the Joint Operating Agreement negotiations - first in her role as Treasurer when she provided the detailed financial information, and then as President during the final stages of negotiations.
- BC Youth Week BC Youth Week 2025, which took place from May 1 7. As part of BC Youth Week, Park Board, with support from local community centre associations, hosted five free city-wide youth activations in community centres across the city. These included ice-skating (with free lessons, skate rentals, and hot chocolate), a basketball tournament, a volleyball tournament, a movie and games night in collaboration with the Kensington Little Mountain Community Policing Centre, and a Dungeons & Dragons event: The Tabletop Tussle.
- W.C. Shelly Park Public engagement for W.C. Shelly Park Expansion will run from June 3rd to June 22nd. Residents in the neighbourhood are invited to provide feedback on the draft concept plan through online or paper survey, as well as at a pop-up event in the park.
