

PARK BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS — July 21, 2025 —

The following information is intended to provide a brief overview of the Board's governance work at the Committee and Board meetings. The full agenda, meeting materials, video clips and official minutes can be found on the Park Board website.

STAFF REPORTS / PRESENTATIONS

Kitsilano Secondary School Synthetic Turf Field & Lighting – Report Back

The Board approved Option 2 of the report, which approved the reallocation and expenditure of capital funding for the Turf Renewal prior to the end of the Field turf's service life, by redirection funds from current Park Board projects at an estimated expenditure of \$1.3M. The lighting installation was approved at the earliest time agreed between the Vancouver School Board (VSB) and Park Board at an estimated expenditure of \$0.8M. Staff were directed to prepare a report to City Council recommending the approval of a construction licence agreement, a Joint Use Agreement, designation of the licensed area to be under the custody, care and management of the Park Board for the duration of the agreements, and expenditure of development cost levies for the lighting installation.

Tree Related Maintenance Services Pre-Qualification – Contract Award

The Board approved the <u>report with amendments</u> authorizing staff to negotiate an agreement for Tree Related Maintenance Services pre-qualification for a list of 8 vendors, with no single vendor receive awards exceeding \$750,000 without separate Board approval. The Park Board will prioritize ecological sustainability, transparency, and risk mitigation in the administration of the pre-qualification list. Further, the Board affirmed that it will retain full control over planning, design, implementation, public engagement and management of urban forestry initiatives, and well as retain oversight and approval authority over the allocation of funding for urban forestry projects.

Stanley Park Hemlock Looper Response and Mitigation Plan – Phase 3

The Board approved the <u>report with amendments</u> directing staff to advance treatment Option 3 for Phase 3 of the hemlock looper response. It was also specified that every effort be made to retain as many dead trees and fallen logs as possible to provide biological value to the ecosystem, and that each treatment area be independently reviewed by the Park Board's Urban Forestry team to examine the assessment before any treatment is undertaken.

MEMBERS' MOTIONS

Think Home Run

The Board referred the <u>motion</u> to the September 15, 2025, Committee Meeting in order to hear from the public. This motion would direct staff to work collaboratively with Jericho Little League to explore the feasibility of constructing and operating an enclosed community baseball training facility at Carnarvon Park.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

The General Manager presented an overview of the GM's Report:

- FWC26 Training Site at Killarney park Construction Update Staff have reached the halfway point of construction at Killarney Park's FIFA Venue Specific Training Site. The staff team meets monthly with Killarney CCA and staff, and the Vancouver School Board principals to keep them informed about the project as it progresses and to resolve any emergent issues. The project is on track to finish on budget as scheduled by the end of the year
- Solar Access Guidelines for Downtown Peninsula Park Board staff collaborated with Planning Urban Design and Sustainability in bringing a report to Council on July 23 on Solar Access Guidelines, which aim to balance solar access in parks and public space with unique economic, geographic and development conditions.



- Urban Park Activation Summer 2025 Recreation and Arts, Reconciliation and Culture staff highlighted a number of projects in parks that create opportunities for community connectedness and social belonging
- Brock House Summer Fair The Brock House Society held their annual Summer Fair on July 12. The Fair welcomed over 2,000 individuals throughout the day, bringing together members, neighbours, local artisans, performers, and over 250 dedicated intergenerational volunteers.
