They do, however, conduct public education through their social media channels and traffic enforcement campaigns.</p> <p>If staff hear of further opportunities related to this subject, they will provide Commissioners with an update.</p>
July 21, 2025	Trafalgar Beach Log Preservation	Commissioner Digby	The Trafalgar Log, an iconic talisman holding the collective memories and secrets of generations of Kitsilano residents, is now sawed to pieces. What can the Park Board do to preserve the remaining pieces of the Trafalgar Log in their present location so that the remaining decades of its iconic presence can be shared by that neighborhood?	Staff in Park Operations have investigated various options and costs to address this recent inquiry regarding this log. Any option besides leaving the log in its current location comes with challenging logistics, substantial cost, additional risk, and staff time. Since repairs to the seawall have been completed, staff are recommending that the remaining segments of the log be left for the same tides that moved it along the beach over recent years will determine the appropriate time for it to leave.
