1.Background &Context







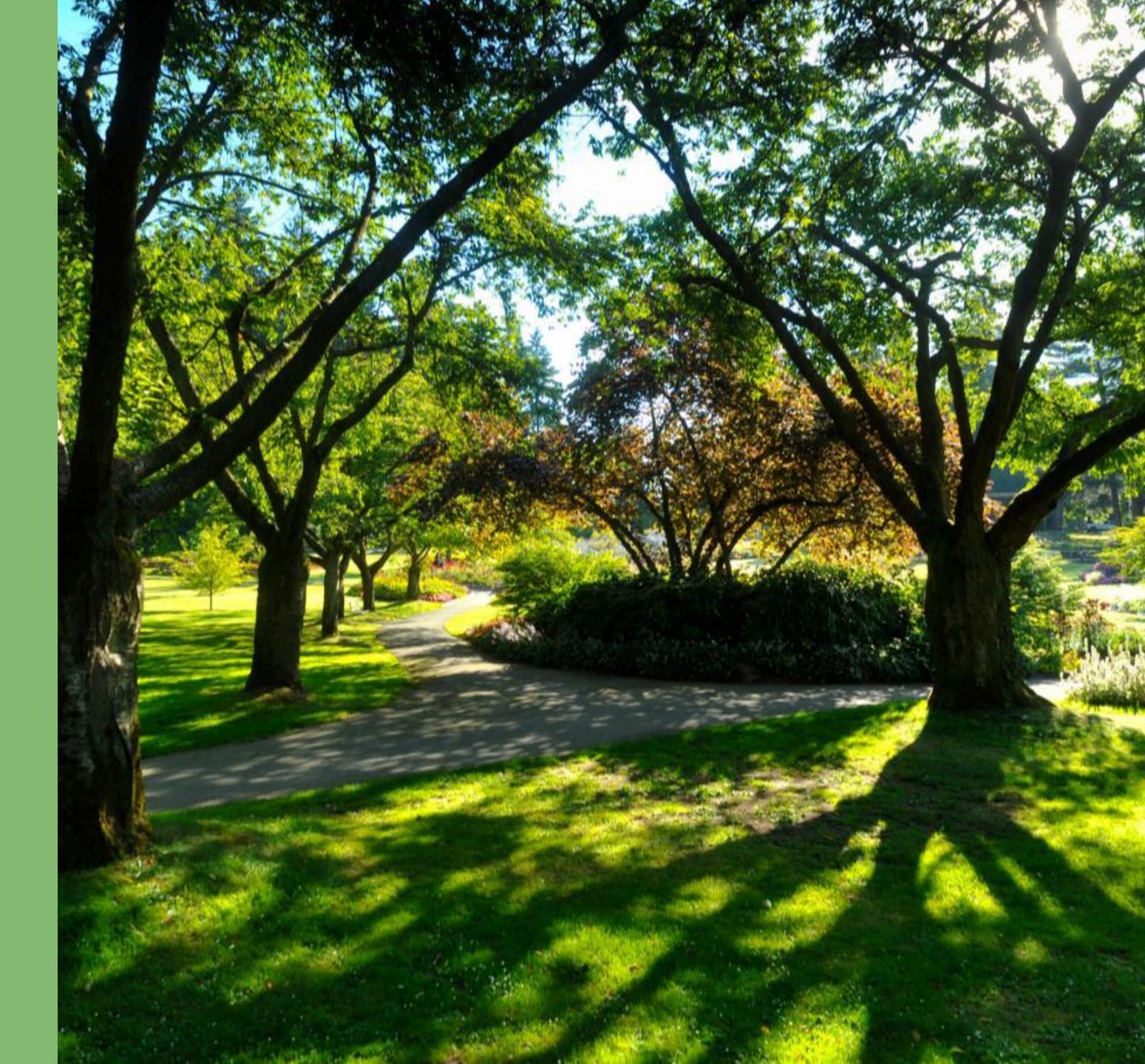
- The Park Board is facing a new set of challenges
  - Continued challenges in finding and hiring resources for auxiliary and temporary positions due to strong and evolving candidate market
  - Difficulties in procuring qualified consultants and respondents for projects
  - The volume of work continues to increase (cross departmental, motions, inquiries, park usage)
  - Significant budgetary pressure anticipated despite the forecasted revenues increase for the rest of 2022 with revenue levels remaining below pre-pandemic levels

#### Revenue Highlights (\$2.9m deficit)

- Lower revenues in key program areas due to continued impact of COVID:
  - Recreation programming (\$5.5m deficit): Main drivers
     Facility capacity constraints affecting ability to generate revenue.
  - -Commercial Operations & Business Development (\$2.3m surplus): Main drivers → Golf (+\$0.9m), Parking (\$1.4m)

#### Expenditure Highlights (\$0.1m surplus)

- Salaries & Benefits (\$1.7m surplus): Main driver → less capacity in facilities and less CCA programming; partially offset by higher Ranger service demands
- Direct & Indirect Costs (\$1.6m deficit): Main driver →
  higher lease charges and equipment costs, security
  costs, and parking management fees related to higher
  revenues







#### **Key Takeaways**

 Significant PHO restrictions were in place until July 1, 2021, with some restrictions remaining until April 2022. This has constrained capacity at Pools, Rinks and Fitness Centres

#### Recreation Program Results:

- YTD 2022 admissions revenues remain consistent with 2021 levels (\$1.1m) reflecting the shift away from preregistration in the first half of 2021 to the usual practice of allowing usage passes & Flexipasses as well as drop-in admission.
- Staffing shortages at rinks and pools are affecting lesson offerings and contributing to lowered patron capacity at pools on weekends

#### 2022 Looking Ahead:

- In addition to continuing pandemic effects on admissions, Q3 attendance will be affected by the July closure of Kits Pool (due to extreme weather damage), resulting in an estimated revenue loss of \$0.1m for Q3.
- The YTD 2022 program revenue shortfall of \$3.8m is forecasted to grow to \$5.2m by Q4 2022

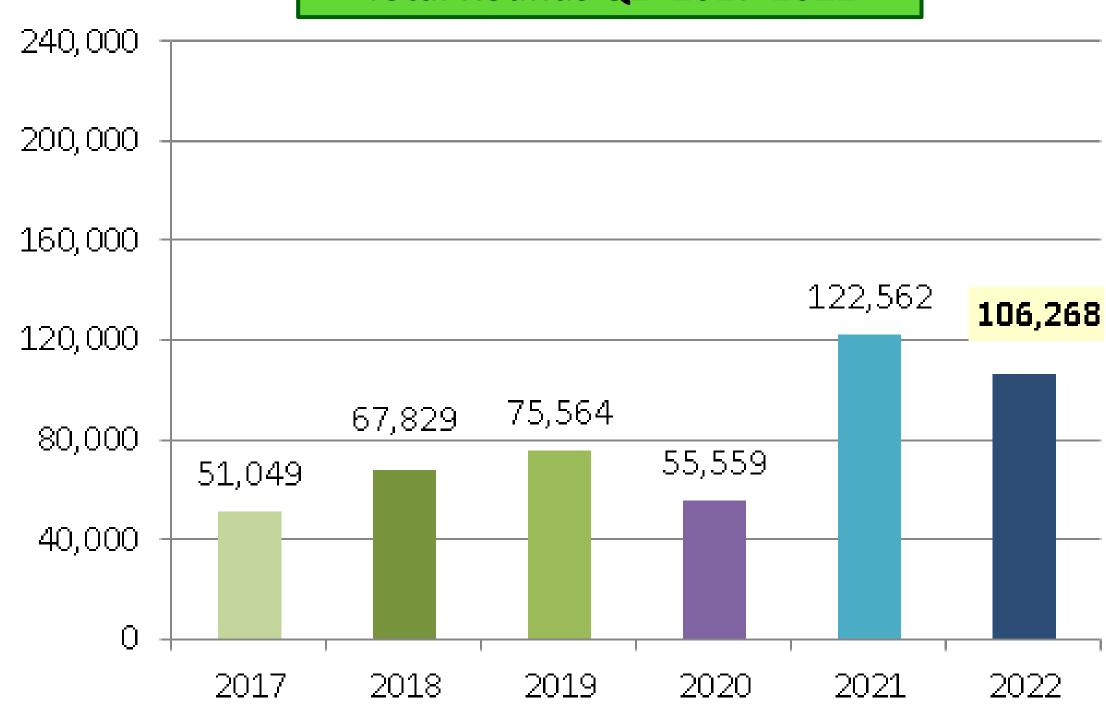
